


Our Story



Working towards Creating a Healthier Society

When we started working at the grassroots level, we discovered that apart from disability and education, the existing health services were inadequate and there was a huge gap in the availability of primary health services. Since primary health services are the cornerstone of health for villages, we adopted the Mobile Medical Unit model that delivered quality primary healthcare services in the rural areas at their very doorstep. The services focused on women and child health. We started with five Mobile Medical Units in the most underserved states in our second year. Each mobile van was well equipped with diagnostic services, medicines, referral and a full complement of medical staff: doctor, nurse, pharmacist, community health worker and driver.





Why Women and Children?

We at THF believe that only by ensuring well-being of women, we can achieve healthier families. Their well-being doesn't only comprise physical care but also emotional and psychological welfare because it has a direct impact on our homes, communities, societies and countries.



Cochlear Implant Program

THF was founded as a society to provide endowment to not-for-profit organisations (NGOs). With a shared vision of creating an equitable society, while we funded our partners in cross-cutting areas of education, health, disability and livelihoods, a need was felt to work in certain areas which needed targeted focused intervention and close monitoring for their maximum impact. We conceived and designed our Signature Programs and self-implemented in the areas of Cochlear Implant, Little Hearts (Congenital Heart Disease) programs for Children and Integrated Village Development Program.







In India, 75% of the healthcare infrastructure is concentrated in urban areas where only 27% of the total Indian population is living. The remaining 73% of the country's population is lacking even the most basic healthcare facilities. The rural healthcare facilities in India are largely under-staffed, with inadequate infrastructure.

With an aim to provide quality healthcare to the underprivileged communities under its mission 'Health for All', The Hans Foundation established two Hospitals – 150 bedded multi-specialty General Hospital in Satpuli and a 30-bedded Eye Hospital in Haridwar – to ensure quality and timely healthcare reaches the remotest corners of Uttarakhand. Ever since THF General Hospital's launch on November 2017, its OPD has registered over 1,25,000 patients; over 800 surgeries have been performed with desired clinical outcome; and over 1,200 admissions and discharges have taken place. In addition, over 700 emergency footfalls and 300+ outreach camps have been conducted through which 50,000+ patients have been screened.

The Eye Hospital offers state-of-the-art Ophthalmology services covering super specialties like Retina, Cornea, Oculoplasty, Glaucoma and Squint, among others. This is in addition to the general ophthalmology such as Cataract and Pterygium. Our Eye Hospital has so far, treated over 60,000 patients, has conducted nearly 20,000 surgeries and has organized 900+ outreach camps. The hospitals have come up as a foremost integrated healthcare services provider in Uttarakhand to provide 'holistic healthcare' for the entire community starting from birth, through one's journey into childhood, adolescence, adulthood and old age.






As part of the Vision Uttarakhand 2020, The Hans Foundation in collaboration with the state government started a primary health program through the Medical Mobile Units (MMUs) in a bid to reach out to the inaccessible areas of this hilly state. Nine MMUs and two mammography vans are being donated to the state taking the total number of MMUs operating in the state to 21. All 21 MMUs are equipped with staff,

medicines and are operated by the THF on the routes specified by the health department which provides government specialists doctors for the medical camps. These MMUs cover 2–2.5 lakh patients in a year.

UTTARAKHAND 2



With seven years of life-changing programs up and running throughout India, The Hans Foundation (THF) has embarked upon an ambitious project, which aims to focus on the all embracing development of Uttarakhand. As current countrywide efforts continue, the major thrust remains on state-wide development to create a successful model.

In November 2014, THF announced vision 'Uttarakhand 2020', a comprehensive development program focusing on disease prevention, health, agriculture, children's education, forest regeneration and water conservation. Mr Manoj Bhargava, Founder and Principal Donor to THF, pledged a generous support of ₹500 crores for the program. As a significant start in this journey, the 'Uttarakhand 2020: Synergy Workshop' was organised by The Hans Foundation in November 2015 at the residence of the then Hon'ble Chief Minister of Uttarakhand, Shri Harish Rawat. It was a unique occasion where the Chief Minister hosted an event of this nature at his residence and brought together all the key stakeholders under one roof: Ministers, senior government officials, 50 eminent organisations, including funding agencies and NGOs working across the spectrum of development.

A historic MoU was signed between the Government of Uttarakhand and The Hans Foundation to collaborate in the fields of education, safe drinking water, agriculture, health, disability and energy. The event was a grand success and Shri Harish Rawat on behalf of the state government, committed relentless support in realizing this collective vision. THF believes that state-wide development is a monumental task that no single player can accomplish. It is a necessity for THF to develop partnerships, increase collaborations and adopt a model to achieve wider impact and scale.



No more ghost villages in Pindar Valley

Our most ambitious Integrated Village Development Program, part of UK Vision 2020, adopted all villages in Pindar valley for implementation of a comprehensive social development program in Bageshwar District. All these villages are cut off from the hinterland

and are located at a height of 6,000–8,000 Feet (above the sea level) in the most inaccessible areas. Under this program, the areas chosen for development are health, disability, livelihoods (agriculture and non-farm), education, water and sanitation and electrification.





A presentation to the THF Chairperson, Ms Shweta Rawat on National Strategy for Inclusive and Community Based Living for Persons with

Mental Health issues in Chennai by the Task Force set up by The Hans Foundation in collaboration with Ministry of Health and Family Welfare.

During one of the retreats in April 2017 with Keystone Human Services International (KHSI), De-institutionalisation was discussed at length. It was decided to set up a task force to evolve a Strategy which serves as a vehicle for advocacy and adoption of De-institutionalisation involving all stakeholders; Govt. and Non-government agencies, educational institutes etc.

The conceptualization of the study directive was done by THF with inputs from various sectors and stakeholders working in the mental health space including the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare and Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment. The central theme of this study was to gather information of people staying in 43 mental institutions of the country for more than one year and formalize recommendations and an action plan for their re-unification with their families and rehabilitation in community homes.

The task force constituted by THF comprised of Director NIMHANS, Director TISS (Chairman of the study), Director IHBAS, MSJE, MoHFW and members from NGOs like The Banyan, ANJALI and Ashadeep. The study has been completed. Supreme Court in an order has asked the Additional Solicitor General of India, representing the Union of India for setting up homes for cohorts of all the 43 mental institutions and to place the study before the court.
