REFLECTING OUR LEGACY

Over the past 15 years, The Hans Foundation (THF) has been a force of compassion, turning values of love and unity into tangible change across India. Founded in 2009, THF began like a single spark, igniting partnerships with local organizations to spread warmth through impactful projects in healthcare, disability inclusion, and water access. By 2014, that spark had grown into a beacon, with 250 partnerships and 340 projects across the country, crowned by the launch of “Uttarakhand 2020”—a bold, holistic program for rural transformation.

As THF entered its second decade, it expanded to new frontiers, spotlighting mental health and inclusive community living. When COVID-19 struck, THF’s response was swift, launching “Operation Namaste” to deliver essentials and deploying Mobile Medical Units (MMUs) as moving lifelines. Entering its second decade, THF broadened its focus to mental health, forming a national

task force and launching the “Love You Zindagi” series.

Just like the metaphorical swan (Hans), THF, spread its wings for healthcare initiatives to Mobile Therapy Buses, Renal Care Centres, and Pediatric and child health programs from 2022. With support from corporate and government partners, THF is now fully dedicated to uplifting India’s most vulnerable as it empowers communities to thrive across India.



EMPOWERING RURAL INDIA





► EMPOWERING RURAL INDIA

Rural areas constitute a significant portion of India's population thus making them an integral part for India's overall progress and development. By empowering rural communities, we can aim to reduce poverty, improve living standards, and bridge the gap between urban and rural areas.

Empowering rural India fosters social inclusion by reducing disparities in access to resources and opportunities. The Hans Foundation's rural development initiatives aim at improving health, promoting sustainable development and enhancing environmental outcomes. A strong, empowered rural sector can create a more balanced and prosperous nation, benefiting both rural and urban populations.

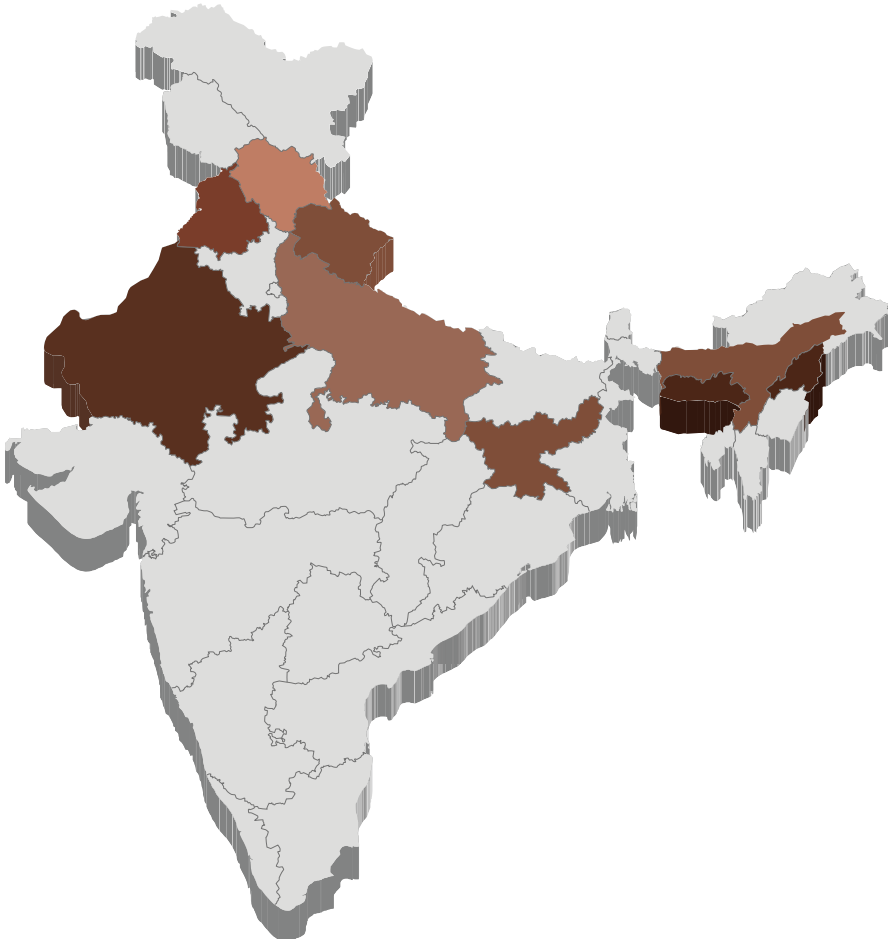
MOBILE MEDICAL UNITS (MMU)

Good public health is crucial for the proper functioning of a society. For a country like India, a robust healthcare infrastructure contributes significantly to the nation's promising economy. However, stark disparity exists when it comes to the availability and accessibility of health facilities in the rural hinterlands compared to urban areas.

To bridge this gap, healthcare delivery models that provide last-mile connectivity in the form of Mobile Medical Units (MMUs) were initiated providing holistic wellness services to the underprivileged and marginalized communities. Offering primary treatment, diagnostic tests and medication, these MMUs reach the most remote areas in rural India addressing the shortage of specialized healthcare personnel and improving health-seeking behaviors.



Equipped with a multidisciplinary team of public health and social impact professionals, the MMUs are operational in 09 states of India with 373 of these units catering to 46 districts (28 aspirational districts), 247 blocks and more than 8,735 villages.

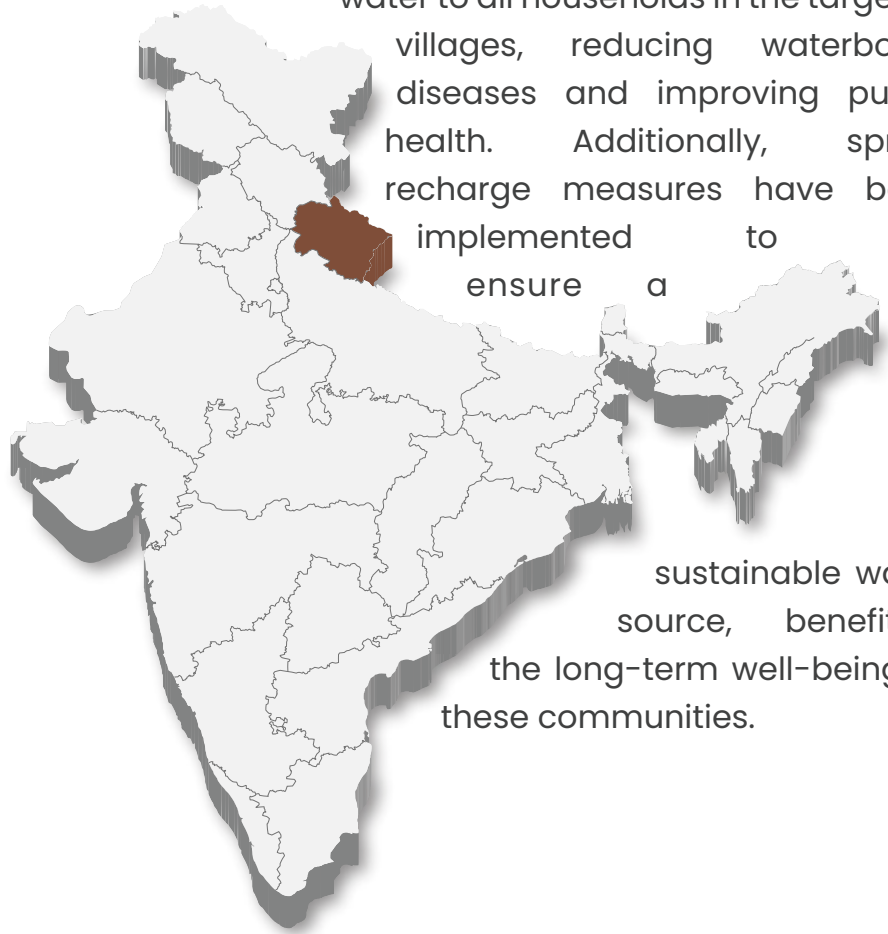

Water is an essential component for the survival of human beings. Its increasing demand has created tremendous stress leading to water scarcity in most parts of the world. Sharing similar woes, many villages in Uttarakhand, struggle with limited access to potable water due to state's complex topography and fragile ecology. Factors like population growth, climate change, and insufficient water infrastructure have worsened the situation in the state. As a result, communities, particularly women, are forced to fetch water from distant sources, which affects their health, hygiene, and overall quality of life.

To address this, The Hans Foundation launched the Jal Dhara initiative in 2019 across several villages in Pauri Garwhal, Tehri Garwhal, Chamoli, Almora, and Bageshwar districts of Uttarakhand. With an objective to ensure piped waters in all its intervention areas the initiative focused on constructing and repairing water supply systems, ensuring funding, and providing technical expertise. It also formed and trained Village Water and Sanitation Committees (VWSCs) to maintain these systems.



Since its inception, the program has provided clean and safe drinking water to all households in the targeted villages, reducing waterborne diseases and improving public health. Additionally, spring recharge measures have been implemented to ensure a



sustainable water source, benefiting the long-term well-being of these communities.

THE HANS FOUNDATION HOSPITALS

The Hans Foundation Hospitals began their journey in 2014 with the launch of The Hans Foundation Eye Care (THF EC), focused on reducing preventable blindness and providing quality eye care to underserved populations in Uttarakhand. Utilizing a hub-and-spoke model, the eye-care center acts as tertiary center in Haridwar and is complemented by secondary hospitals and vision centers throughout the state. Inspired from its success, THF expanded its healthcare initiatives in 2016 with The Hans Foundation General Hospital (THF GH), a first of its kind multi-specialty hospital in Satpuli.

Healthcare Beyond Boundaries

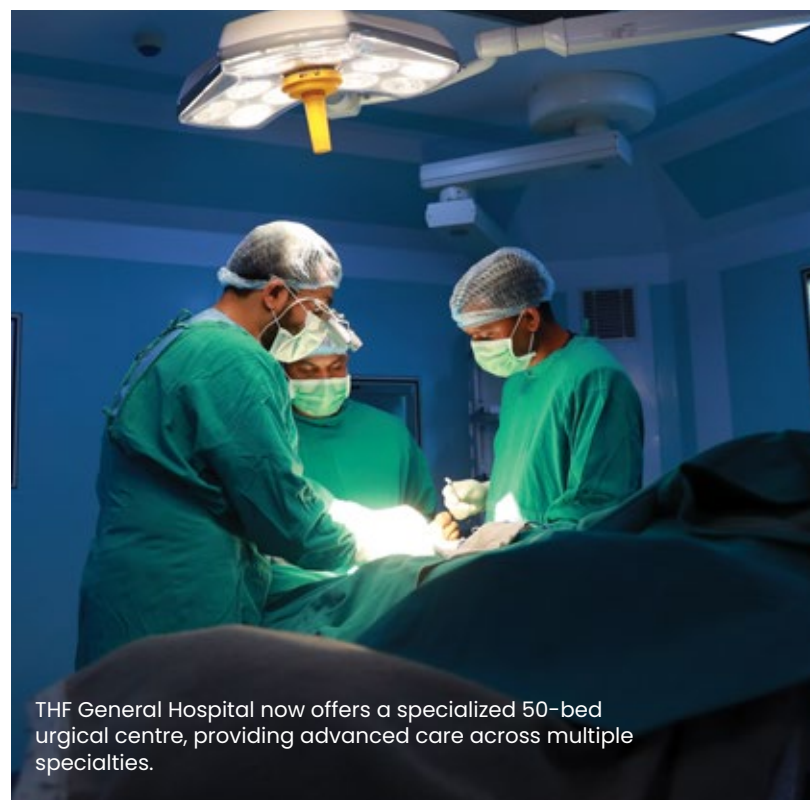
■ **Specialized Surgical Care now at THF General Hospital:** THF General Hospital at Satpuli now offers a specialized 50-bed surgical centre, providing advanced care across multiple specialties. A skilled team of 60 professionals, including 15 doctors, 25 nurses, and 10 technicians, delivers top-tier surgical services through strong set of evidence-based protocols which is supported by the framework of clinical governance and credentialing. Key specialties include Orthopaedic Surgery, Gynaecology, Ophthalmology General Surgery, and ENT.

■ **A visionary decade for THF Eye Care:** Celebrating its 10-year milestone in June 2024, THF Eye Care has now evolved into a 100-bed multi-specialty facility, offering a full spectrum of medical services. While maintaining its core focus on eye care, the hospital now provides additional specialties, including Internal Medicine, ENT, General Surgery, Orthopaedics, Intensive Care, Radiology, and Pathology. This expansion enables the hospital to meet the broader healthcare needs of the community, granting underprivileged patients access to world-class treatments across multiple disciplines under one roof.

■ **New Dawn for Healthcare in Kotdwar:** Inaugurated on the auspicious occasion of Shri Bhole Ji Maharaj's birthday in July 2023, The Hans Foundation Clinic in Kotdwar provides a full spectrum of healthcare services for the local communities. Operational seven days a week, the clinic offers not only medical consultations but also specialized counseling, rehabilitation, and educational programs to support patients and their families holistically. For cases requiring advanced medical intervention, The Hans Foundation Clinic facilitates seamless referrals to THF GH, enhancing patient access to intensive care services and improving healthcare delivery efficiency.

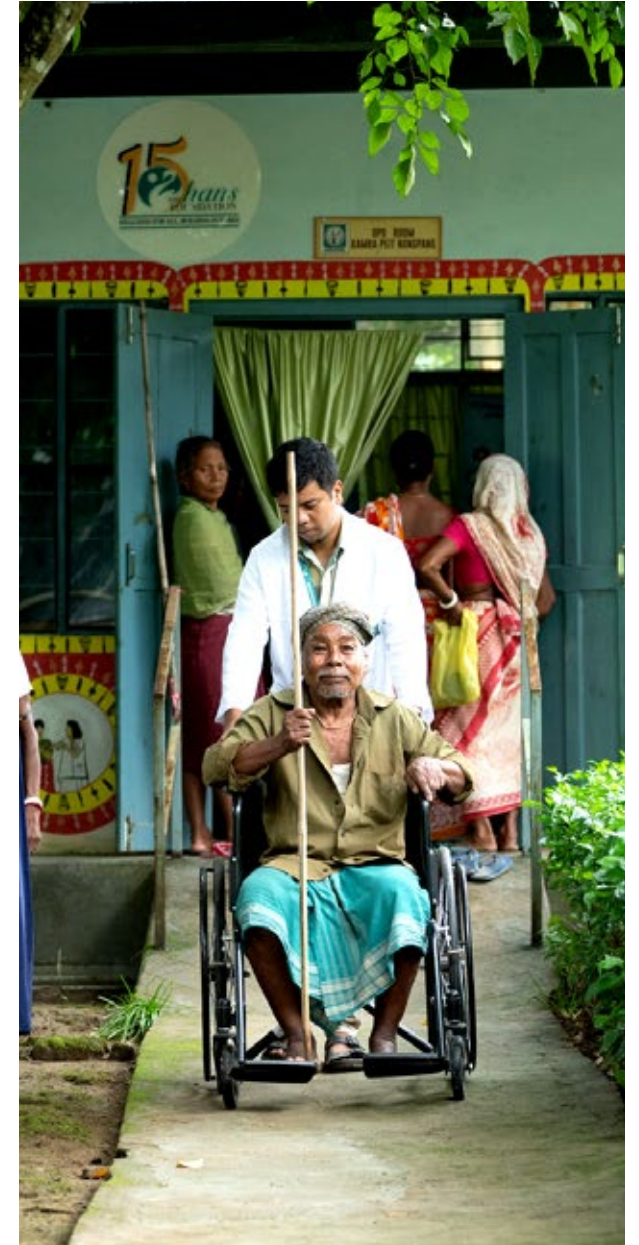

COMMUNITY CARE



► COMMUNITY CARE

Health is a key indicator of a nation's well-being. With a population of 1.45 billion, the health infrastructure in India is overwhelmed by the increasing demand of providing quality care to everyone. Major healthcare challenges stem from poor infrastructure, insufficient facilities and equipment, and lack of human resources or their effective utilization. The outbreak of the recent pandemic showcased a glimpse of the gaps in our healthcare systems. Moreover, while many in rural India lack access to basic healthcare, others bear a heavy financial burden from seeking quality medical care, which is often private and expensive.

With a focus on improving India's overall wellbeing, Community Care can help reduce burden on hospitals and can provide culturally-sensitive personalized care. Collaborating with various governments, The Hans Foundation aims to strengthen the public health infrastructure through providing operational support for running Primary Health Centres, Community Health Centers, as well as Sub-Centres and MMUs in some of the most remote parts of the country. These health centres play a major role in helping the government make healthcare accessible to the underserved. Similarly, the Hans Renal Care Centres (HRCCs) focuses on reducing financial burden on individuals by providing them free or affordable dialysis care to patients suffering with End Stage Renal Disease (ESRD).



THF aims to strengthen the public health infrastructure by providing operational support to health centres in remotest parts of the country.

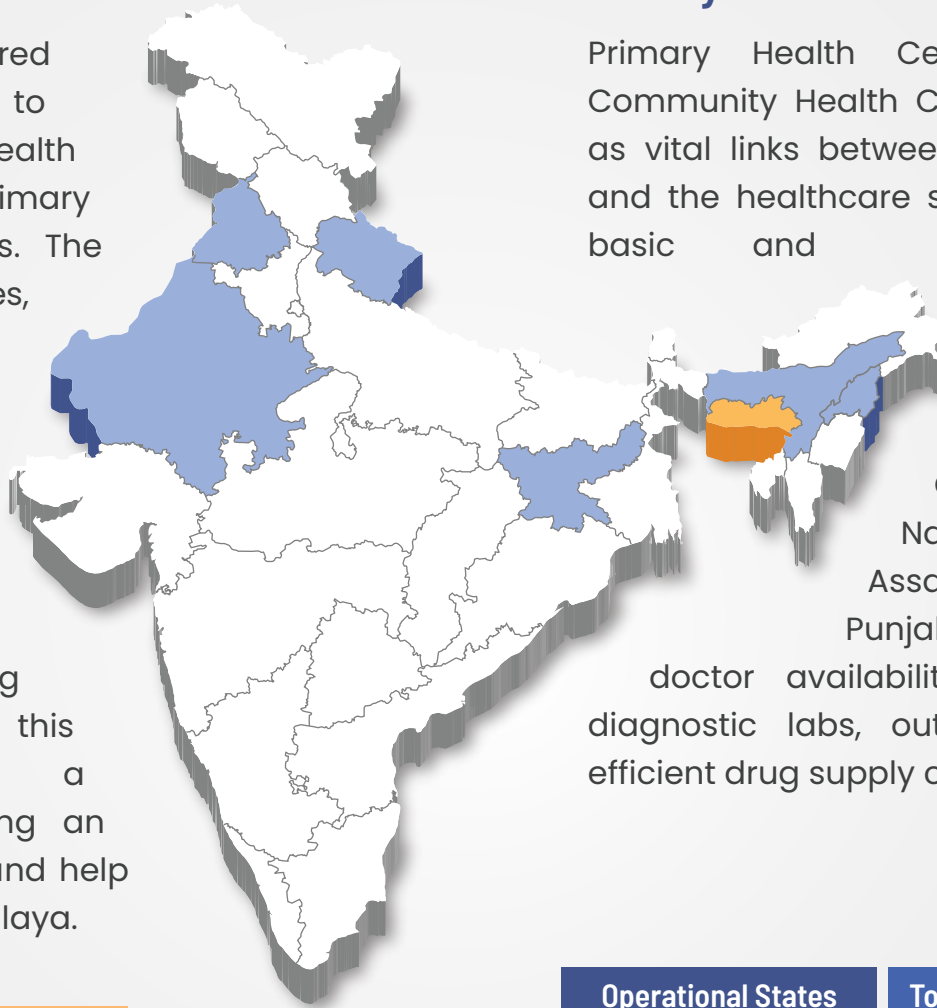

PRIMARY HEALTHCARE IN VILLAGES

Sub Centres in Meghalaya

In 2021, The Hans Foundation partnered with the Meghalaya government to enhance and operate around 50 health sub-centres, focusing on primary healthcare and maternity services. The foundation manages these centres, deploying essential human resources to strengthen rural health infrastructure. Following Ayushman Bharat guidelines, the centres address infrastructure gaps, ensure medicine availability, and promote behavioral change. Aiming to improve grassroots healthcare, this collaboration demonstrates a comprehensive care model, setting an example for other states to follow and help bridge resource limitations in Meghalaya.



Primary & Community Health Centres

Primary Health Centres (PHCs) and Community Health Centres (CHCs) serve as vital links between rural communities and the healthcare system, offering both basic and comprehensive care. THF enhances healthcare services through its 10 PHCs and CHCs in Uttarakhand, Nagaland, Rajasthan, Assam, Jharkhand, and Punjab by ensuring 24/7 doctor availability, fully operational diagnostic labs, outreach camps, and efficient drug supply chain management.

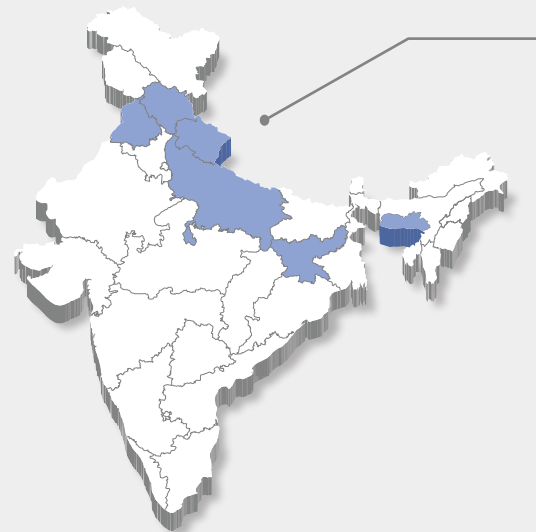

HANS RENAL CARE CENTRES

End-Stage Renal Disease (ESRD) is the final stage of Chronic Kidney Disease (CKD), where kidney function is nearly lost. In India, 2.2 lakh new ESRD cases emerge yearly, creating a demand for 3.4 crore dialysis sessions, but with only 4,950 dialysis centres, mainly private, less than half the demand is met. The high cost of dialysis, about ₹2,000 per session, results in annual expenses of ₹3-4 lakhs, placing a significant financial burden on patients.

The Hans Renal Care Centres (HRCCs) address these issues by offering free, accessible, and effective dialysis services in Uttarakhand, Jharkhand, Himachal Pradesh, Punjab, Uttar Pradesh, and Meghalaya. In partnership with state governments, these centres provide free dialysis treatment to patients in the respective states. However, while operating as standalone models the centres offer services at subsidised rates as charitable entities. The initiative also focuses on recruiting and training skilled staff and equipping centres with necessary infrastructure. The program aims to deliver quality dialysis to people in remote areas, reducing out-of-pocket expenses and travel time, ultimately improving their well-being.

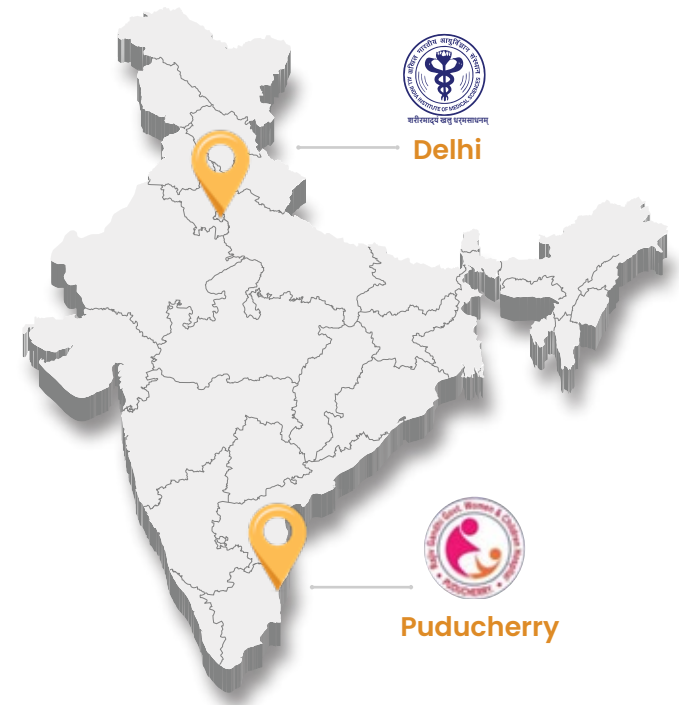
Children hold immense emotional significance for families and communities. Thus, providing them access to quality healthcare is crucial for the right development of their physical and mental abilities. The Hans Foundation's initiatives—Mobile Therapy Bus, Early Intervention & Childhood Development Centres, and Hans Paediatric Program—provide personalized care for children, especially those with disabilities. These programs offer early healthcare, alleviating both the emotional and financial burdens on families. The early interventions through these initiatives fosters inclusivity, enabling children with disabilities to become active, valued members of society and lead healthy, fulfilling lives.



EARLY INTERVENTION & CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT CENTRES

Early childhood, from conception to age eight, is a critical phase during children’s formative years. They are most vulnerable in their initial stages with the first 1000 days being crucial for brain growth. In India, about 45% of young children are at risk of developing some sort of neurological disorder in the absence of timely screening, detection, and intervention.

The Hans Foundation, in collaboration with AIIMS, New Delhi and Rajiv Gandhi Maternity and Child Government Hospitals, Puducherry, has developed state-of-the-art facilities for early detection and intervention for children with developmental delays and neurodevelopmental disorders like Autism, Cerebral Palsy, ADHD, and specific learning disabilities. The center offers tailored, multidisciplinary care to help each child reach their full potential based on their capabilities. The goal of this initiative is to enable children to become competent, socially-included members of society, ensuring they lead a high-quality life. Among various services, the centre provides psychological assessment and counselling, special education support, physiotherapy, speech therapy, vision & hearing assessment, transfer of skills to parents, occupational therapy and dietary counselling.

MOBILE THERAPY BUS

Drawing inspiration from MMU's doorstep delivery of healthcare services, the Mobile Therapy Bus was launched in 2023 providing specialized care to individuals that demand high support needs and disability-specific services. Working in collaboration with the National Institute for the Empowerment of Persons with Intellectual Disabilities (NIEPID) the program focuses on providing holistic services ranging from early screening and identification of any form of disabilities to all age groups.

Operating in **Noida, Ghaziabad, Mumbai, Kolkata and Ajmer**, these 30-seater buses are equipped with specialized chambers for therapeutic interventions, advanced assessment tools, and trained professionals. Believing in 'The Earlier, The Better' approach the buses provide comprehensive care and rehabilitation services. The program also educates parents, caregivers, and communities on working with all kinds of disabilities by raising awareness and changing narratives, in and around disability. It also trains local health workers to identify developmental disorders early and refer families to the mobile unit for further assistance.

Paediatric care, focusing on infants, children, and adolescents, plays a key role in diagnosing and addressing their unique health needs.

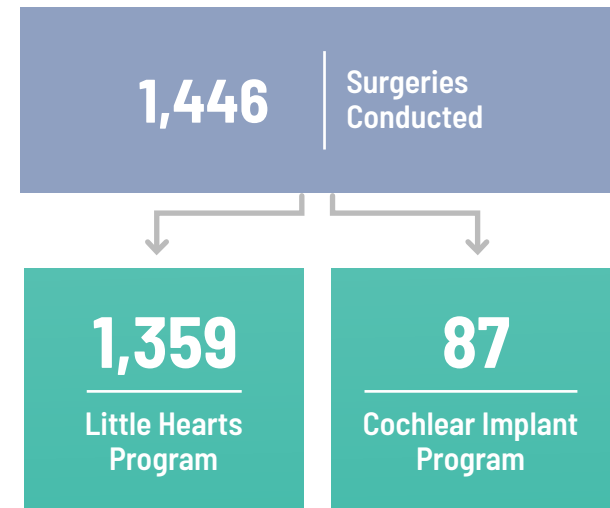
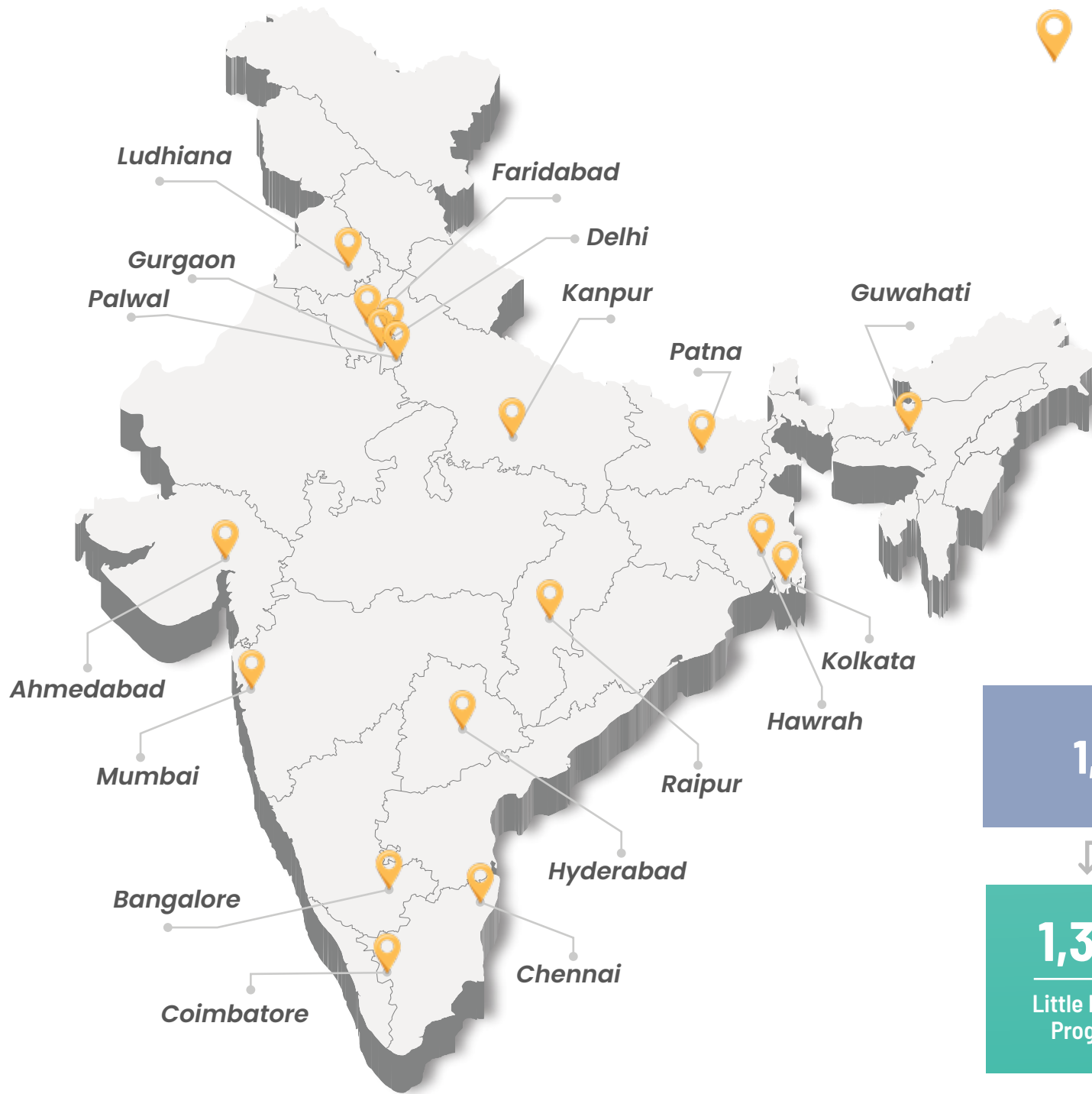
The Hans Paediatric Program, an umbrella initiative by The Hans Foundation, provides quality healthcare to children for marginalized communities across India. The program aims to reduce child mortality and morbidity through early detection, management, and treatment of critical conditions. It takes a family-centred approach, involving parents and caregivers in the healthcare process by offering education, guidance and other support in child health.



Through partnerships with reputed hospitals, The Hans Paediatric Program, provides medical and monetary assistance to the families of the underprivileged ensuring that the children receive the right care they need for a healthier future

With an objective to stimulate hope, the program provides medical and monetary assistance to the families of the underprivileged thereby alleviating their financial burden and ensuring that the children receive the right care they need for a healthier future. Through partnerships with reputed hospitals, the program offers support for children with congenital heart defects (Little Hearts Program), congenital hearing loss (Cochlear Implants Program), and assists in providing Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU), Paediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU), cancer treatment, bone marrow transplantation and epilepsy treatment.

Schools are the cornerstone for children's physical and emotional development. They serve as essential environments for learning, socialization, and emotional growth. Thus, inclusivity is an essential part of school environments where every child must feel valued and supported thereby fostering their self-esteem and motivation. Additionally, prioritizing mental and physical health enables full participation in learning, leading to better attendance and academic performance.

Recognizing this, The Hans Foundation's Project Unnati and Hans Wellness Centre provide resources to create equitable learning environments supported by quality healthcare, ultimately empowering children to reach their full potential.



PROJECT UNNATI

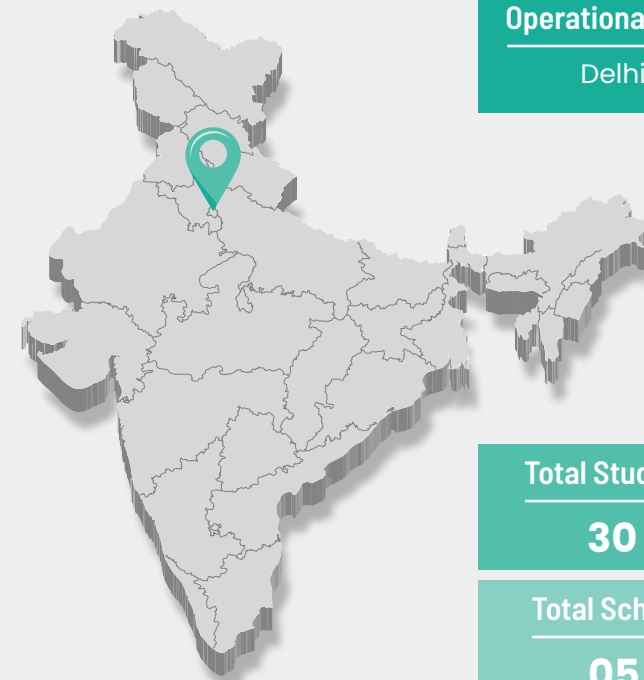
THF strongly believes in promoting diversity and acceptance of individual differences. Nurturing the same idea, Project Unnati was initiated with an aim to help schools develop ecosystems where all students including Children with Disabilities (CWD) can be provided an inclusive platform for learning. The program aids in bringing structural changes in the education system by reshaping schools, classroom settings, and other activities so that students can learn and participate collectively.

Under the project, THF works with partner schools to help in improving their inclusive quotient and enhancing their knowledge about the potential abilities of Persons with Disabilities (PwD). This is done through the physical auditing of the schools to identify the lack of accessibilities for CwDs. A resource centre, equipped with accessible teaching and learning materials for children with disabilities, is developed in partner schools. These resource rooms are managed by special educators, who provide support to the children to overcome any learning difficulties and also assist schools in sustaining inclusion.

The initiative also imparts training to teachers in inclusive frameworks like Differentiated Instruction (DI) and Universal Design for Learning (UDL). These frameworks help tailor lesson plans to diverse learners' needs, including CwDs. Moreover, the program also sensitizes the school staff for fostering inclusion in sports, extracurricular activities and for strengthening socialization/friendship/relationships.

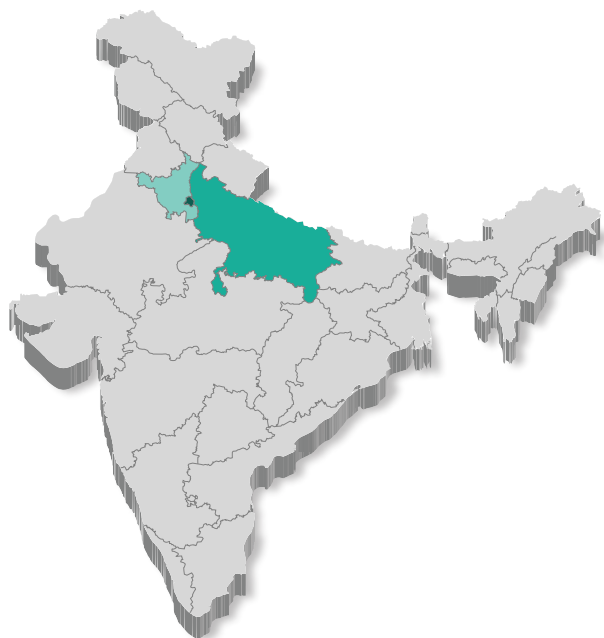

HANS WELLNESS CENTRES FOR SCHOOLS

The Hans Foundation initiated Hans Wellness Centres (HWCs) initiative in 2022-23 with an objective of improvement in the physical, mental, and social well-being of school-age children which can help them lead a healthy life. Partnering with low-income private, NGO-managed and aided schools, the HWCs provides primary healthcare by pairing the interventions of diagnosis, treatment and prevention related to the physical and mental health concerns of the children.

Operating through a team of qualified doctors, psychologists, nurses and multi-tasking workers, these centres conduct regular health check-ups, screening and tests to assess any early physical or mental health concern. In case of identification of any diseases, disabilities and deficiencies, the team presents the student to the doctor for OPD treatment or refer to higher care depending on the conditions. Meanwhile, mental healthcare services include basic assessment, counselling, life skill session, and limited psychiatric evaluations. Apart from providing medical interventions, the centres promote health-seeking behaviour among children through special engagement activities and health awareness sessions.

PRESERVING THE GREEN



► FOREST FIRE AND MITIGATION PROGRAM

Forest fires, also known as wildfires, are considered as one of most harmful disasters due to their widespread environmental and ecological impacts. With forest cover of nearly 68%, prevention of wildfires is of utmost importance in states like Uttarakhand. Studies have indicated that 9 out of 10 forest fires are anthropogenic. Thus, understanding the need to educate and prepare communities against this man-made disaster, THF's Forest Fire Prevention and Mitigation Program aims to mitigate fire risks through a multi-faceted approach that includes preventive measures, community engagement, and rapid response.

Working in collaboration with the Forest Department, the program's sustainability is ensured through involvement of communities and training of local volunteers thereby fostering a sense of ownership among residents. The program also engages in reforestation efforts to rehabilitate areas damaged by fires, promoting long-term ecological restoration. Through these efforts the initiative ensures that the communities are well-prepared to handle fire outbreaks before they intensify, which plays a critical role in preserving both biodiversity and local ecosystems. Ever since its inception, the program has resulted in a 53.33% decrease in forest fire incidents in the targeted regions of Uttarakhand.

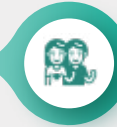

EXPANDING HORIZONS





▶ EXPANDING HORIZONS

Education is considered one of the key indicators of a nation's economic development. However, many in India are deprived of this basic right due to financial constraints or lower socioeconomic status. With a purpose of bridging the educational gaps, THF's Hans Nayi Disha and Hans Learning Centres initiatives provide quality learning opportunities to the children belonging to marginalized communities. These programs aim to enhance academic performance through remedial classes, improve foundational skills in core subjects, and foster an inclusive learning environment. By addressing the educational needs of marginalized communities, THF empowers children to pursue better futures and contribute meaningfully to society.

HANS LEARNING CENTRES

The Hans Learning Centres (HLC) was launched in 2023 in Alwar district, Rajasthan, with an objective of providing remedial education to children belonging to marginalized and underprivileged backgrounds in six centres of Thanagazi and Narayanpur blocks. These centres focus on improving academic performance in Mathematics, Science, and English of students from grades 6 to 12.

A dedicated team of 18 teachers works across the centres, benefiting more than 350 students. The project addresses educational challenges in a region marked by low literacy rates, poor infrastructure, and socio-economic hardships. It aims to uplift students through targeted learning, especially those engaged in seasonal labor who often lag academically.

Significant achievements include the exceptional performance of 39 out of 53 students appearing in their class 10th board exams and two 8th graders who have qualified for the National Means-cum-Merit Scholarship Scheme (NMMSS). In addition to academics, the centres offer holistic development through sports, cultural activities, and career guidance.

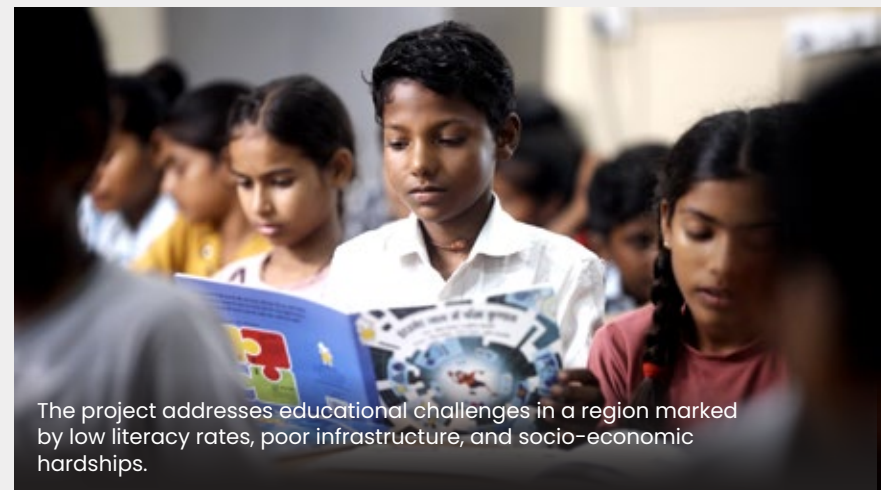
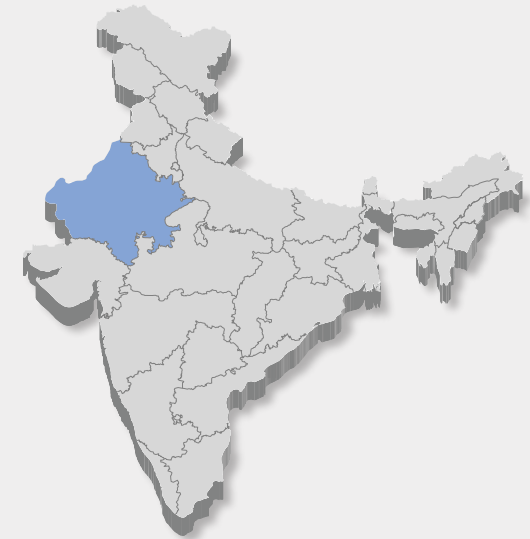

HANS NAYI DISHA

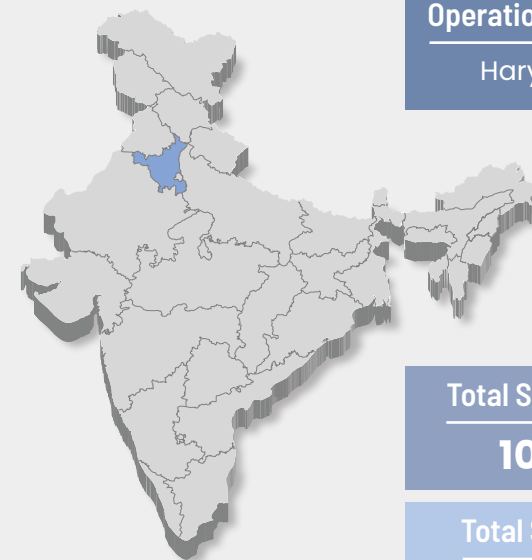
The Hans Nayi Disha initiative is aimed at educating children from slums or underprivileged backgrounds. Based in Gurgaon, Haryana, the school under the initiative provides basic but quality education which helps them transition into regular schools. Their curriculum covers English, Hindi, Mathematics, Computer Science, and Environmental Studies, allowing them flexible age-to-class placements based on each child's capabilities. Supported by highly competent staff, the teachers engage with parents to support students' academic progress.

In addition to academics, the initiative also provides mid-day meals to children and emphasizes extracurricular activities like art, craft, physical education, and field trips to enhance overall student development. Regular health check-up camps are also conducted under the supervision of doctors who ensure that students receive routine medical assessments and guidance on hygiene.

Equipped with an experienced team of educators and caregivers, focus is made on the holistic development of children, ensuring their physical, emotional, and cognitive growth. By fostering a supportive, inclusive environment, the staff helps children discover their talents through diverse programs in arts and life skills, encouraging them to reach their full potential.



Supported by a highly competent staff, the Hans Nayi Disha initiative aims to educate children from slums or underprivileged backgrounds by providing them basic but quality education which helps them transition into regular schools.

THF- SEWA BHARTI SEWA DHAM VIDYA MANDIR SCHOOL PROJECT

Partnering with the charitable organization, Sewa Bharti, 'THF- Sewa Bharti Sewa Dham Vidya Mandir School Project', was initiated in 2023 with an objective to enhance the education, health, and sporting skills of 325 students in grades 6-12. Aligned with Sustainable Development Goals 2, 4, and 8, the project provides academic, nutritional, and extracurricular support to promote quality education, better health, and employability. While Sewa Dham Vidya Mandir School manages daily operations and facilities, THF funds the initiative, providing subject-specific specialists, professional sports coaches, and instructors in yoga, art, and performing arts and scholarship support to avail job oriented coaching classes. The joint collaboration fosters an inclusive environment that encourages students to excel academically and personally, equipping them with skills and experiences for a brighter future.



THF – SEWA BHARTI BALWADI PROJECT

The Hans Foundation (THF) and Sewa Bharti's Balwadi initiative focuses on enhancing early childhood education for 250 children aged 3-6 in socio-economically marginalized communities. This project aims to upgrade ten Balwadis with digital learning tools, aligning with Sustainable Development Goals 4 and 8 to ensure inclusive, equitable education and promote sustainable economic growth. Each Balwadi will be equipped with smart learning equipment, student kits, and a well-trained teaching team. THF manages resources, training, and monitoring, while Sewa Bharti provides physical space, community mobilization, and administrative support. Collaborative engagement with parents and quarterly reviews further strengthen the program, focusing on quality, accessible education that prepares children for formal schooling.

THF's livelihood programs aim to empower underserved communities by creating sustainable economic opportunities. Through its initiatives, THF provides skill development, vocational training, and entrepreneurial support to marginalized groups, including women, youth, and returning migrants. These programs focus on enhancing income generation through self-employment, technical assistance, and access to financial services. By integrating health and social support, THF's livelihood efforts not only improve economic independence but also contribute to the holistic well-being of its beneficiaries.



HANS UDHYAMITA MISSION

Committed to its cause of inclusive and sustainable development, THF launched the Hans Udhyamita Mission with an objective of fostering entrepreneurship and livelihood opportunities. Targeted particularly for the upliftment of marginalized communities in India, the initiative focuses on empowering individuals through skill development, financial literacy, and creating sustainable means of livelihood. The goal is to provide people, especially in rural areas, with the tools and training needed to establish small businesses or engage in local enterprises that can improve their economic standing.

Working with the government of Uttarakhand, the program strategy includes offering advisory services, technical assistance, and personalized business plans developed with domain experts. The beneficiaries include mostly in-migrants of the state along with participants registered under the Mukhyamantri Swarojgar Yojana whose livelihood was affected due to COVID-19. To ensure success, the project connects entrepreneurs with financial institutions and organizes loan fairs for easier access to credit.

Additionally, training, mentoring, and networking services help entrepreneurs set up businesses, identify market opportunities, and develop soft skills. The program is implemented with MSME support and banking institutions for effective loan disbursal. The mission supports various sectors like agriculture, handicrafts, and small-scale industries.

HANS GAUSHALA

Focusing on the wellbeing of animals, THF through its Hans Gaushala Program aims to create sustainable systems for the maintenance and overall health of the cattle, particularly cows. The program is designed to provide care and shelter to abandoned, sick, and elderly cows and integrates related aspects of it such as organic farming, production of bio fertilizers, and cow-based products like dairy and manure.

Employing a team of 21 individuals, the initiative conducts veterinary health camps across Delhi and its NCR regions, where injured animals are treated and free medicines are distributed to cattle owners, which aids in timely recovery of the animals. The Hans Gaushala features two shelters—one for healthy cows and another for sick or recovering animals. Regular health check-ups and vaccination drives are conducted at these shelters which helps in prevention of spreading of any diseases within animals. The program also provides rescue and ambulance services to transport injured animals to the Gaushala or referral hospitals. During their recovery or care the cattle receive a balanced diet for better health and productivity, including concentrates and supplements.

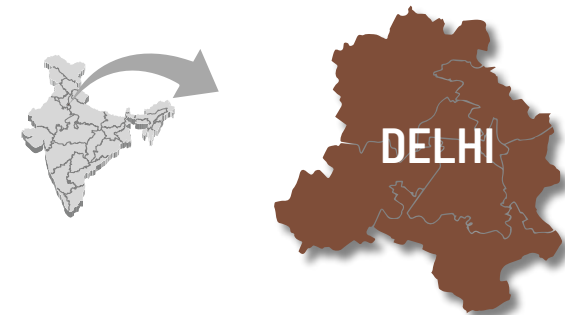
The Gaushala also provides occasional awareness campaigns on goat farming and disease control, along with anti-rabies vaccination drives. Furthermore, the cow waste generated at these shelters also provide natural fertilizer which helps in ensuring the cultivation of safe, chemical-free vegetables.

TITAN KANYA+



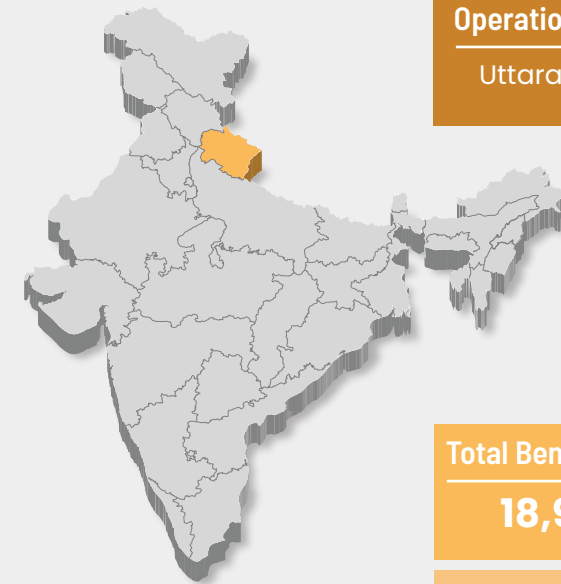
The Titan Kanya+ program is a collaborative effort of THF and Titan Company under its CSR initiative. Launched in 2022, the project aims to empower girls from marginalized communities by supporting their education in four Government Girls Inter Colleges (GGICs) of Udham Singh Nagar district in Uttarakhand. Targeting over 4,300 girls from disadvantaged backgrounds—many of whom are first-generation learners—the project seeks to address issues like early marriage, domestic labor, high dropout rates, and gender inequality.

Key components of the project include academic support, life skills education, career guidance, and stakeholder engagement. Academic support is provided through personalised tutoring, remedial programs, and the integration of technology to enhance learning. Life skills training, endorsed by the WHO, aims to equip girls with critical skills for decision-making, self-awareness, and stress management. Career guidance helps students explore educational and career opportunities, aligning with their skills and interests.

Additionally, the program actively engages parents, teachers, and communities to foster a supportive learning environment. A unique aspect of the initiative is the Titan Kanya+ Educational Endowment, which provides financial assistance for higher education, covering tuition, books, and other expenses to empower young women for future success. Continuous monitoring and evaluation ensure the program's effectiveness and long-term impact.

The handloom sector is a significant source of employment after agriculture and supports over 16 million weavers across India. While it contributes 11% of total textile production the sector faces challenges like low productivity and competition from power looms. However, an increasing demand for eco-friendly, handmade products has brought renewed attention to handlooms, both nationally and internationally.

The Himadri Hans Handlooms - Capacity Enhancement of Rural Artisans (HHH-CERA) aims to empower rural artisans particularly in Himachal Pradesh's Kullu and Mandi districts which are known for their handloom tradition. A joint collaboration of the HDFC Bank & THF, the initiative aims to uplift the artisans by forming Self Help Groups (SHGs) and providing training in various handloom techniques, product development, and modern loom handling. The project also plans to introduce 148 modern looms, 70 sewing machines and solar lighting systems to improve production efficiency.

Moreover, HHH-CERA focuses on both technical as well as marketing training of the beneficiaries. Under this initiative, artisans learn how to use modern CAD systems for designing and developing value chains for marketing. A strong emphasis is placed on market linkages, with artisans participating in exhibitions and online sales and establishing a strong customer base which will help long-term growth and commercialization of handloom products in Kullu and Mandi.

VARANASI MMU

ROADIS

In 2022, The Hans Foundation, in collaboration with ROADIS, jointly launched an initiative to provide essential healthcare services through MMUs in four blocks of Varanasi. Serving around 80 villages in these blocks, THF's four Mobile Medical Units (MMUs) provided essential healthcare services in rural areas with limited medical access. Supported by the Uttar Pradesh government and health authorities, the initiative aims to reduce healthcare expenses and improve community well-being by offering doorstep services, including over 30 pathological tests, facilitated by qualified MBBS doctors and paramedics.

The program also includes health awareness sessions, reaching over 6,000 beneficiaries, and a specialized Menstrual Health Management program for adolescent girls in these villages. Focusing on menstrual hygiene and care the health workers under the program conduct regular meetings and provide sanitary kits to the girls.

Moreover, specialized health camps addressing orthopedic and gynecological issues are also organized catering to the specific needs of the communities. In addition, eye check-up camps are also held in different villages, providing free eyeglasses to the beneficiaries. Meanwhile the initiative also aims to improve awareness by conducting health education through Nukkad Natak (street plays) promoting hygiene, disease prevention, and eye care awareness.

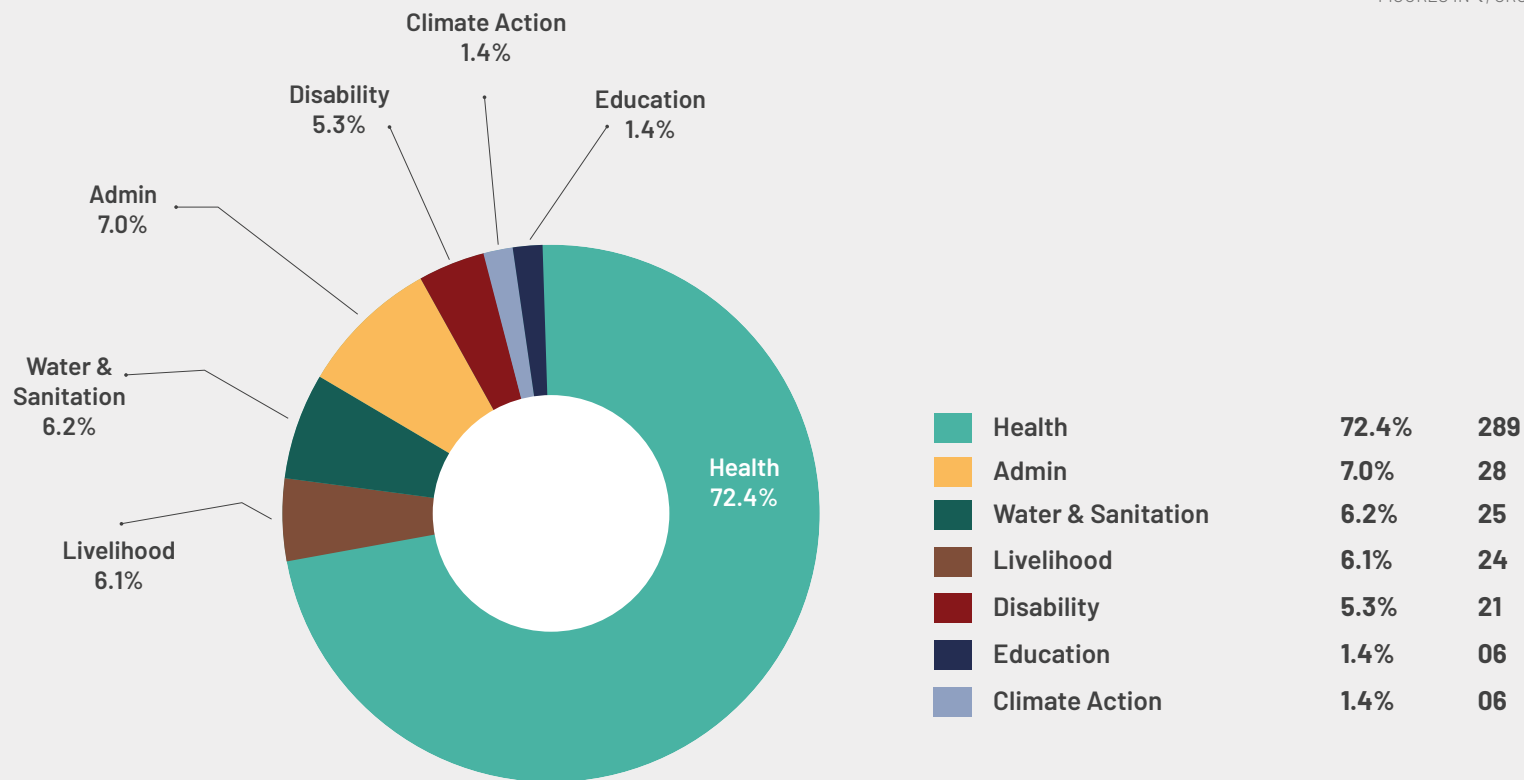

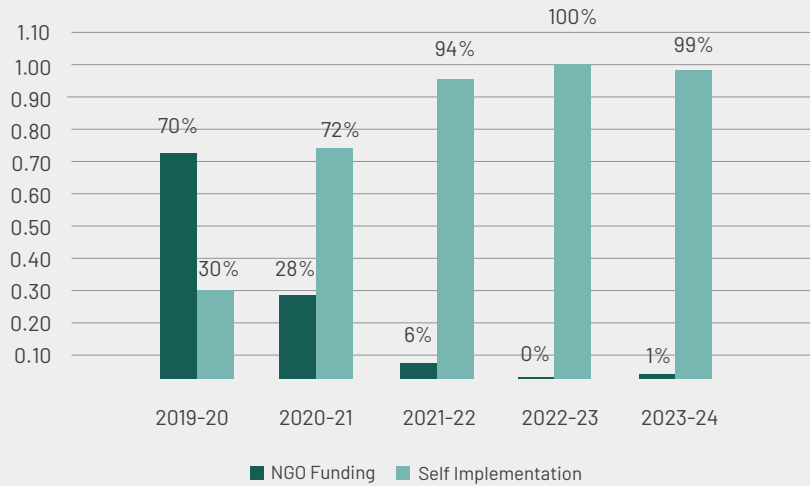

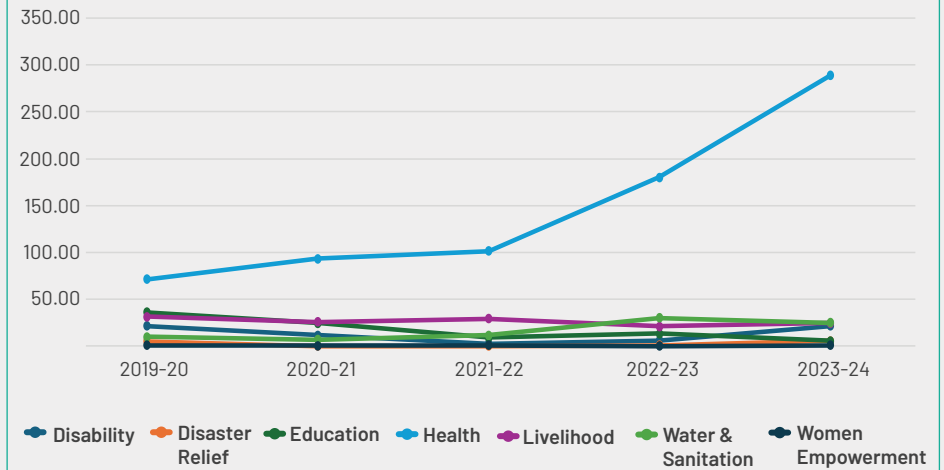

Year wise comparison of self implementation and NGO Funding 2019 - 2024



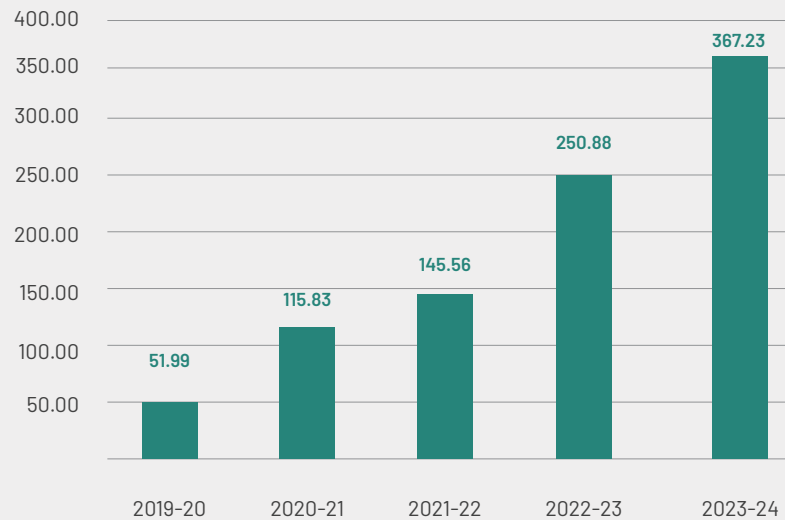

Thematic Area wise trend of spending during 2019-2024



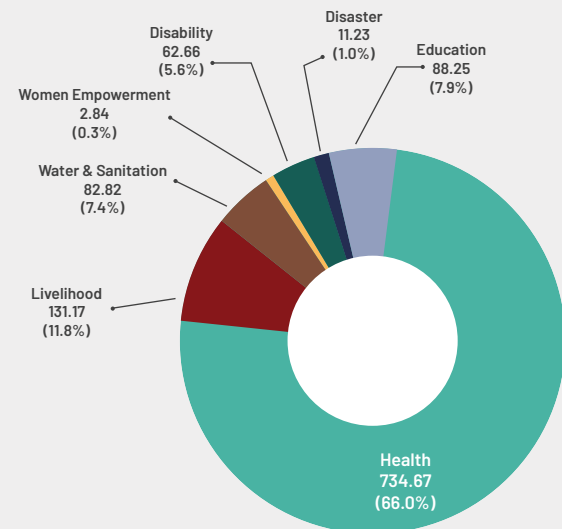
